Most of all, I love how this project offers us an opportunity to recreate our district structure so that it serves our present reality. We can begin anew, start from scratch, and build something new and wonderful that works for us, today, where we are now.

It is such an honor to be your District Superintendent and partner in ministry. I am excited to serve you and to join with you in all that is to come. Come what may, we have the hope and the power of the One whose name means "God is with us." We are

not alone. We live in God's world, and we have each other. As iron sharpens iron, so shall we continue to bless each other as together, we journey the narrow paths of discipleship, all for the glory of God and God's Kingdom.

From our District Director of Congregational Excellence: Rev. Dale White



I began my appointment as the Director of Congregational Excellence on 1 July, simultaneously with the new District Superintendent, Doug Forrester. Together with Donna Desper and David Mawyer, we have formed quickly to be a cohesive team responsive to the needs of the district.

During this short period of time, much has been accomplished. During the months of July and August, cluster meetings were held to meet clergy, ask them what they were most excited about in their appointments, and what their concerns were. This gave me and the DS an opportunity to meet everyone and get a sense of what is energizing them, and what concerns we need to support them on.

Strategic planning is a major component of the position of Director of Congregational Excellence. Since July, we have pushed out four comprehensive emails on the topic of Strategic Planning, including the importance of having a clear mission and vision, and the importance of realistic goal setting with clear objectives. I have met with three pastors to help them frame their strategic planning sessions, and I have met with two other churches in person as leadership teams to discuss how to plan strategically for effective missions.

In my role as a member of the District Developers Team, all new members were trained as Simplified Accountable Structure coaches for the conference. The SAS process has developed over the past few years, with lessons learned requiring churches to be more discerning before making leadership structural changes. In that spirit, an email was sent out across the district in October, specifying the process for moving to an SAS structure, the discernment process, and the requirements for a coach.

An additional strategic initiative we have begun is to connect with the Conference Office for Clergy Professional Development, and Wesley Theological Seminary, to propose the development of a church administration certification program for pastors. Together with Dr. Doug Powe from Wesley and Rev John Thomas, a United Methodist Elder and professional fund-raising consultant from Lexington, the DS and I are coordinating a possible certification development and requirement for late 2022 or 2023.

It is an honor and pleasure to serve the churches across the Staunton District, and to support the District Superintendent and team during this challenging time of pandemic amidst changes in our conference and denomination.

From the Chair of our District Committee on Ordained Ministry



The Staunton District Committee on Ordained Ministry (DCOM) is amenable to the Virginia Annual Conference through the Board of Ordained Ministry. It is responsible for assessing candidates for ordained ministry, as well as for serving as local pastors and certified lay ministers on the district; this includes assessing their readiness, fitness, and effectiveness in ministry. This committee interviews candidates as they pursue their call and theological education before they go to the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry for provisioning or ordination as elders and deacons.

The Staunton DCOM meets throughout the year to interview candidates inquiring about a call to ordained, licensed, or certified ministry; those seeking certification as candidates for ordained ministry; those seeking provisional membership as a deacon or an elder; and those seeking to be licensed or to continue their license as a local pastor. The committee also interviews those who wish to be certified lay ministers. We are thankful that God continues to call people to minister in our churches.

As of October 2021, the Staunton District has:

- 6 persons who are admitted candidates, discerning their call to licensed or ordained ministry
- 2 persons who have received recommendations for their applications to become provisional members (elder track)
- 2 persons who are certified lay ministers

The Committee also has the privilege and honor to meet annually with 17 licensed local pastors who serve churches throughout the Staunton District. The committee is responsible for the renewal of their licenses for ministry in the local church.

A person's call to ministry is most often recognized and nurtured in the local church. Therefore it is the mission of the local church to be vigilant in encouraging those who have gifts and graces for ministry to explore a possible call to ministry. It is a primary focus of the Virginia Conference to nurture and encourage young people to recognize that they may have gifts and a call to ministry. Keep aware of how God may be moving among the people, especially young people of your congregation so that a person may be led to explore and respond to God's call to ministry in Christ's church. Anyone who thinks they are experiencing a call to ministry should contact their pastor. The United Methodist Church has a well-defined and purposeful process to aid one in exploring and confirming one's call to be a licensed or ordained pastor in the United Methodist Church.

The Staunton District Committee consists of clergy and laity. The members of the committee are: Bill Bearden, Joe Cailles, Peter Choi, Ann Grimmer, Anita Jackson, Janet Knott, Ryan Oswald, Mark Reuter, Dale White and Doug Forrester.

2020 Board of Missions Report Staunton District of the United Methodist Church

The Board of Missions of the Staunton District is now in its second half century of ministry. Its registration with the State Corporation Commission was renewed in April 2021.

Funding for the work of the Board of Missions comes from several sources:

- \$5,000 (January 2021) was received from the Staunton District Fund apportionment for the Board of Missions
- Second Mile Club members (individuals and organizations) gave \$5,751.60.
- Principal investments for Investment Fund and The Palmer Bequest with The Virginia Conference United Methodist Foundation had an unrealized loss of \$521.75. Investment balances were \$20,826.67 and \$8,722.23 respectively.
- No-interest loans balance totaled \$3,030

Expenses related to the closed churches were \$14,092.66.

Since the last Annual Meeting, The Board of Missions has offered:

Grants of over \$23,465

- A Grant to South Covington UMC to help with their food pantry;
- A Grant to Basic UMC to help with their food pantry;
- A Grant to Greenville UMC to help with repairs to our Rooftop Commercial HVAC unit possible, drainage and septic system repairs at our parsonage;
- A Grant to Just Neighbors to help with legal costs;
- A Grant to Disaster Relief to help with needed materials in the Staunton Flooding.

Embrace



Embrace is the church at work, united as the body of Christ beyond its buildings. We functions as an extension of the Church with the financial support and hands-on participation of UMC congregations, members of the ecumenical community, and people of peace and good will.

Mission Outpost, Laboratory, and Incubator

The ministry that effectively launched Embrace, **Secret Boutique**, was planted at 932 Fir Street as joint outreach ministry of Basic and Wayne Hills UMCs. Based on its success, the Staunton District committed the building to use as a mission outpost and a place where new models of ministry and worship could be cultivated, a community cared for and strengthened, and the greater church could come to try new things, learn new lessons, and be re-invigorated.





Amazing things happen at God's house. This place is a holy resource dedicated for the equipping of God's people and revelation of God's Kingdom on earth. We view the Embrace campus as God's house, complete with a big lawn and garden.

INTERIOR: The majority of our spaces are multi-functional, able to accommodate the changing needs of a vibrant family. The former **sanctuary** is filled with tables and chairs and serves as a **community**

gathering space where all of God's children are welcome to live, love, learn, eat, and worship. Currently under construction in this Gathering Space is a feed eleget and library. This area also feetures a study and shildren's play.

a food closet and library. This area also features a study and children's play area. Three former classrooms house a clothing ministry and hair salon. A conference room is home for Sin Barreras, a community partner that serves our immigrant neighbors. A laundry center has been added to the kitchen, and the pantry converted to a prayer room. The hallway houses a small café, and a coat area is now a coffee-and-conversation nook.



EXTERIOR: We see our building truly as God's house, fully equipped with the tools we need to love each other well—and to learn to do so even more effectively. With this home, we

believe God has provided a **big back yard** to enjoy together, and a **garden** where we gather to nourish each other and be nourished. Our grassy city block is being converted into a **public gathering space** with **community gardens and orchard, prayer labyrinth, picnic shelter, playground, and park.**

Minutes – The Eighty-Second Session (2020) The Staunton District Conference By Zoom – November 24 at 6:30 p.m.

The Eighty-First Session of The Staunton District United Methodist Church Conference was held on Tuesday, November 24, beginning at 6:30 p.m. by Zoom. Rev. James Carey, District Superintendent, presided.

Rev. Carey welcomed everyone to the Zoom Meeting and stated that we are making history with the first Staunton District Conference being held by an online Zoom meeting. He then called the meeting to order. Beth Christian, District Director of Congregation Vitality, was monitoring the Chat button for questions or comments. Jay stated that it was decided that this was the safest way to do District Conference since the pandemic is hitting our District hard again.

Rev. Carey gave welcome to the new clergy that were present: Rev. David Breeden and Pastor Cody Adkins from St. Paul's UMC (Craigsville), Rev. David Rash from Sherando UMC, Rev. Marion Sortore from Central UMC (Clifton Forge), Rev. Nona Allen from Fairfield Charge, Rev. Bill Jones and Rev. Jose Colon-Hernandez from Basic UMC, Rev. Joe Shoop from Main Street UMC, Rev.
