Social Action: Advocates

Advocate: as a noun, an advocate is a person who represents another person's

interest

Advocate: as a verb is to add a voice of support to a cause or person

Biblical definition: one who pleads another's cause, who helps another by defending or comforting him/her

Christ gives this name three times to the Holy Spirit (John 14:16, 15:26, 16:7), the Greek word, parakletos or paraclete here means "Comforter" or more literally "the one who is beside us".

When advocating for others: be a good listener, be supportive, have all the information and be a good representative.

An Advocate should be actively fighting for justice when any injustice occurs, making changes to the unjust issues and/or systems.

In a recent <u>Faith Talks (Jan. 2)</u> Mama Iva Carruthers said, "We are our sisters' and brothers' keepers". Rev. Dr. Susan Smith said," Never stop resisting! Resist or lose rights!" Her book is **With Liberty and Justice for Some.**

During our Leadership Training Days (Nov. 21-23) Brittany K. Barnett shared her story of working with women and families related to unjust systems. Her book A Knock at Midnight (Leadership Development 2023 UWF Reading Program) explains what it takes to bring hope and justice to people trapped in a system.

Advocating in the next Quadrennium, pages 40-43, our January-February response emphasizes our United Women in Faith's priorities for 2025-2028: Mass Incarceration and Climate Justice. There are websites given to keep us connected, informed and engaged in this work. Relating to Climate Justice, Robin Wall Kimmerer's book Braiding Sweetgrass (Spiritual Growth, 2024 UWF Reading Program) shares her Indigenous wisdom in advocating for the care of our Earth.

Jesus said, "Love the Lord your God with all your passion and prayer and intelligence'. This is the most important, the first on the list. But there is a second to set alongside it: 'Love others as well as you love yourself'. (The Message, Matthew 22:37...)

I have never been so proud to be a member of the United Women in Faith as I was at the last grant application acceptance meeting.

We had a record number of grants to review from local and international missions, including one to a group of amazing women in Ukraine. In a recent UWF 'Still In Mission' episode, Ukrainian Methodist Reverend Yulia Stardubets spoke on the difficulties her church faces in a country at war. I will outline the grants that were accepted and encourage all to consider the two grants that are opening March 1st.

With the opening on October 1st, we received an application from an interpreter at our last Mission Encounter (now Mission u, yes with a small 'u'). A minister from the West Congo Annual Conference, **Cesar Lodiha Akoka**, applied for tuition assistance for his General Chaplaincy Program Master's in CPE (Clinical Pastoral Education) at Wesley Theological Seminary in DC while his wife, **Clarice Ndaya Kadima**, and 4 year old son, **Ferdinad Akoka Lodiha**, are in Zimbabwe.

Clarice requested assistance with her annual tuition as she is working on her Master's in nursing at Africa University and was awarded \$2,690 from the Katherine Kyle fund against her \$3,550 annual tuition. We also awarded their son \$1,440 for the first three trimesters of his pre-school since education for children in most countries is not free.

We were able to assist two missions in India and one in Bangladesh. The *Reach All Nations Community Development* proposal for India was among the programs requested for creating Children's Tutoring Centers in Tribal Communities to address critical needs for education, healthcare, and nutrition for a year for each of the 16 centers that are needed that support 25–30 tribal children each. We granted \$1,660 for support for one of these centers.

The Visionary Network for Missionary Children's Development Program assists children of missionaries, who live and serve in remote rural areas of India, with food and education. There are 48 of these missionary children, from ages 2 to 13, throughout India and we supplied

them with \$50 per child for food, books, exam fees and other educational materials for the next year coming to \$2,450.

Another exciting mission is the *Prime Evange-listic Church (PEC) Children's Safe Home in Bangladesh.* Bangladesh is a Muslim-dominant country with Christianity being only 3% of the population. The PEC has established 38 churches and 2,600 former Muslims have been baptized. Their school age children are isolated and stigmatized since their parents have become Christians, hence the need for the safe house for these kids to receive support including a formal education, not otherwise available to them. This safe house for children costs \$2,500 a month and we donated \$2,000 towards this cause.

There was a request from the Mission Central Children's Clothes Closet in the Shenandoah River District. Their request for \$5,000 will cover the costs of clothes, diapers, formula and other baby supplies for the 591 families they serve including 1,369 individual children. In 2024, they distributed 88,152 diapers up from 2023.

Another grant for \$4,000 from Fort Hill UMC's UWF unit with half going for hands-on educational materials in reading and math supporting the 364 students of the recently accredited Perrymont Elementary School. The second half will go towards continued support to missionaries Rev J and T Park in Southeast Asia for educational materials for underprivileged children for a summer English program as well as VBS and Sunday School materials, targeting poor communities in collaboration with the network of UM churches.

We also supported *Vulnerable Children's Food Needs* in a school in **Rwanda**, **Africa** for 105 children to receive a cup of porridge twice daily and nutritious meals such as rice, beans and bananas over the next six months, directly impacting their lives and showing God's love.

Last, but not least, was a grant for \$7,600 to a group of ladies in **Ukraine** who, from their own pockets, founded "**VALUES**", the first public cultural-educational psychological recover center in Kyiv, for those whose lives have been shattered by war; mothers whose children have gone missing; mothers and wives whose loved ones are in captivity or have been maimed and/or killed in battle; thousands of orphaned children who have lost their parents as well as so many displaced persons, mostly women and children, living in countries not their own.

This core of women volunteers support this 3,000 sq foot center out of their own pockets, pay for the utilities and internet as well as bake bread daily so everyone who enters their doors receives a small loaf of bread and hot tea. This is the only center in Ukraine operating in such a format let alone created and run by women.

Because Ukraine's energy infrastructure has been destroyed, they were in desperate need for an inverter (generator) and heavy duty batteries to keep the center operational during the long harsh winter months. The cost was far beyond their means.

Since they are located near four universities and five schools, students come to the center to have a warm, quiet space for internet access to continue their studies. Over the last year, they organized and held 314 events for those that use the center daily.

They have promised that at every event held at "VALUES", they will specifically emphasize the support of the Virginia Conference United Women in Faith and will also organize media articles highlighting our assistance in sustaining their center during the these harsh winter months as a token of their gratitude for our unwavering support for the Ukrainian people who aspire to a peaceful future for their children and elderly parents.

The women at "VALUES" recently sent back to us via a local Nelson County humanitarian/professional photographer, Glenn Tupper, who visits Ukraine several times a year, and arranged for our funds to get to them personally.

He returned from his last trip with a framed plaque from "VALUES" that reads:

From our hearts the great thank you

United Women of Faith of the Virginia United Methodist Church, Virginia Conference

for your support to volunteering cultural center "Values" that had created by Women of Ukrainian organization "For Family Values".

In our days Kyiv stands without light and warmth during for 6-8 hours every day.

Our center is a home for everyone who needs to feel "You are not alone".

Thousands of children, widows, pensioners and veterans will have light and warmth with your help!

For us in the Advent season your help is a true miracle and a manifestation of the Lord's love and support for the things we do every day as volunteers.

From this day on, our home is your home! Our daily prayer will include gratitude to you and your families. Everyone who comes to our "VALUES" center will know about your help.

We dream that one day we will meet you in peaceful Kyiv and be able to thank you for the good that you have done for us and Ukrainians!

With all grants that we have given out this year, I have requested follow ups and pictures to reinforce the good that we do around the world as well as here at home. Ladies, we have amazing stories about all that we do, we just need to tell them. Maybe we can't all go into the mission field, but we work very hard to support those who are in the mission fields at home and abroad.

I also want to emphasize the importance of **ENDOWMENTS**. We could not have achieved this level of UWF Virginia Conference giving, if it were not for those in our past who so believed in the organization, that they set up these endowments for good. 


